She was beaten by about three yards by Jennie Woodd in the breaststroke, but she more than made up in the backstroke, pulling ahead, and in the final freestyle she hit such a big stride that she finished at least 20 yards ahead of her sister, Gladys Slaght, who also pulled away from Jennie Woodd in the freestyle lap.
