Manager Sawtelle Announces Complete List of Events With Their Starting Times

**T**HE complete program for the 55th annual Regatta Day to be celebrated with a varied assortment of races on Ala Moana channel Saturday afternoon, was released yesterday by Bob Sawtelle, manager of the Regatta.

The program calls for the first event at 1 o'clock. The final event will be started at 4:45 o'clock. This means that a four-hour program is in the offing.

The first event will be the finish of the yacht race. From then on there will not be a dull moment until the canoe sailing race, listed to start at 4:45 a.m. over with.

The program includes yacht races, sampan events, canoe races for both men and women besides the barge events. For good measure, there will be a capsizing drill by the Coast Guard cutter "Itasca" crew.

The day will be climaxed by a big Regatta dance at the Waiialae Golf Club starting at 8:30 o'clock.

## Regimental Golf Teams Compete At Schofield

### Lewers, Cooke Trophy At Stake; Eighteen Holes Medal Play

**E**IGHT teams will battle for the Lewers and Cooke golf trophy at Schofield Barracks, the qualifying round having been held on Wednesday afternoon over the Inland Post course.

The teams that qualified for the match play include the 35th Infantry, the Staff, the Civilians, the 27th Infantry, the 21st Infantry, the Air Corps the 8th Field Artillery and the 11th Field Artillery.

Drawings for the first round of play which must be completed by Sept. 27 are as follows: 35th Infantry vs. 11th Field Artillery; Air Corps vs. Civilians; 27th Infantry vs. 21st Infantry; and 8th Field Artillery vs. Staff.

The second round must be completed by Oct. 4 and the final round by Oct. 11. The tournament is being handled by the regular tournament committee of the Schofield golf club, of which Thomas A. Abel, vice president of the Bishop First National Bank, and manager of the Schofield branch of the bank, is chairman.

The Lewers and Cooke trophy is a large shield on which is engraved, annually, the names of the winning team. In addition the individual members of the team receive small cups.

This year the teams will play two-somes match play, the team with the low score being eliminated from the tournament. This is a change from previous years, when every team played every other team, to the great detriment of interest before the final matches were played. All stymies have to be played in this tournament.

The teams will consist of four members, and no substitutes will be allowed except in case of illness of a playing member of a team. Each match will be at 18 holes, match play, the score being determined by the number of holes up a player has on his opponent, the four team mem-
