

ALA MOANA CHANNEL WILL BE SCENE OF 17-EVENT PROGRAM

General Admission Price Reduced From 50 To 25 cents. Attractive list of Trophies At Stake

ALL roads lead to the Ala Moana today for the 51st renewal of Regatta Day which will be celebrated this year with a colorful program of 17 events which is scheduled to start at 1 o'clock and run until 5 p. m.

Bleachers, providing a bird's eye view of the entire course, have been erected along the banks of the Ala Moana channel. These seats will be on sale at 25 cents and \$1.00.

The dollar seats are reserved and are close to the finish line. The general admission was reduced from 50 cents to 25 cents yesterday.

An attractive list of trophies has been secured by Bob Sawtelle, manager of the Regatta to be awarded as prizes. At a meeting of the committee in charge of today's program, it was decided yesterday to award the trophies as follows:
