## **FIVE RACES ON** CREW PROGRAM

Sawtelle Announces Plans For Regatta On the Ala Moana Channel

Five barge races and outrigger canoe events will be on the rowing program to be staged Saturday morning along Moana channel.

Bob Sawtelle, Myrtle boat club official who is handling arrange-ments for the program, an-nounced this morning that he is working with G. D. (Dad) Center and Charlie Amalu to arrange for the Outrigger canoe races. Indications are that the Outrigger Canoe club and the Queen's Surf club will be represented in these events.

The rowing program is an out-growth of a friendly challenge by the Navy to the Myrtle senior crew. Tentative plans had been made to send these crews to Kauai to participate in a regetta planned there Saturday, but when the Kauai trip fell through it was decided to stage a match race here.

After arranging for the senior match race it was decided to work out a program of other races, and five barge events are on the pro-gram. In addition to the senior event there will be a freshman race, novice event, intermediate race and at least one other inter-club event. The Japanese and Myrtle clubs plan to enter crews in the freshman, novice and in-

termediate races. termediate races.

The plan is to start the first race at 9 a. m. Saturday and Sawtelle declared this morning that he expects to have all the events run off by 11 o'clock.

The committee plans to have an admission charge of 10 cents to help defray expenses of trans-porting boats and other expenses which may arise in connection

with the program.

The Myrtle crews have been working hard in preparation for the races, especially the senior ag-gregation. Navy is in first class shape for the event and the Myrtles expect a tough race when they run up against the sailors.
