#### RAINBOWS COP RELAYS

The University of Hawaii cleaned up in the relays for men, breaking the standard in the 300 yard medley by five seconds and establishing a new record in the 200-yard event at 1 minute 40.2 seconds.

On the medley relay team were Powers, breaststroke; R. Rath, backstroke; and Wilfred Paul, freestyle; and on the 200 yard relay were C. Weight, Jack Johnson, Wilbur Craw and Jimmy Hurd.

The time for the 300-yard medley relay was 3:30.4.

In the 200-yard relay, the Army gave the Rainbows a battle royal. Weight spotted the collegians a slight lead on the first lap, but Tannehill overtook Johnson on the second lap to give the army the lead. However, Wilbur Craw swam a potent third lap and retrieved the van for the University. Jimmy Hurd then sustained the advantage to finish several yards ahead of the army anchorman.

The first record to go by the boards last night was the 50 yard freestyle for girls under 13 years of age, Miss P. L. White negotiating the distance in 35.8 seconds, and lowering the former standard by 6-10 of a second.

Waidlich of the Army shattered the record in the 100-yard breaststroke novice for men, with a time of 1 minute 15.8 seconds. The old standard was 1:17. A moment later Miss L. K. Paulson splintered the record in the 100 yard backstroke novice for women, stopping the watches at 1 minute 30.4 seconds.

#### RECORDS ESTABLISHED

Besides the 200 yard relay for men, new records were established in the 300-yard medley junior for men, which Adolph Desha of the University won in 4 minutes 2-10 seconds, and in the 200-yard relay open for women, which was won by the Outrigger C. C. (Mrs. Hooper, Gladys Slaght, B. Stevenson, and Olga Clarke) in 2:9.2.

Bill Pady, Jr. won the 50-yard freestyle for boys under 13, Kander-son of the University won the 220 yards novice for men, and K. Kawada triumphed in the 100 yard freestyle for boys under 16 years of age.
