Mildred Slaght Hooper of the Outrigger Canoe club cracked the second record of the evening when she splashed her way over the 300 yard medley in 4 minutes 39.4 seconds. She established the former standard of 4 minutes 50.6

from the seconds in 1936. In swimming the event better than 11 seconds faster than the old time, Mrs. Hooper, finished about three fourths of a lap ahead of her nearest rival, Gladys Slaght.
