OUTRIGGER CLUB WINS

In the first women's event of the evening, Kuulei Paulson of the City-wide team won in the 50-yard novice freestyle in 33.2 seconds. The Outrigger Canoe club's medley relay team of Gladys Slaght, Mildred Slaght Hooper, and Olga Clarke established the record of 4:08.6 for the 300-yard event, a newcomer to the swimming program.

Bayne and Nakamura of the Forty-and-Eight were the only finishers in the 500-yard freestyle for junior men. Bayne's winning time of 6:30.6 is a record, the event having been inaugurated last night. His margin of victory in the race was by inches, and the judges could have called the race any way and satisfied the crowd. Bernard Koseki won the 150-yard novice medley in 1:52.9 to set another record for a new event.

A Forty-and-Eight relay team won the novice men's 200-yard relay in 1:46.2, rounding out the evening's event. After the meet, two University teams put on a snappy water polo exhibition with Caddy Weight's team winning.

The University won honors in the combined class division, while the Outrigger Canoe club women mopped up the wahines' events.
