

RAINBOWS NOSED OUT IN A.A.U. COMPETITION; ONE RECORD BROKEN

University Cracks Put Up Bitter Fight—Jimmy Hurd Loses to Tannehill—Alvarez Retains Diving Title

A RMY'S team is champion in the Hawaiian A. A. U. indoor swimming championships after its whirlwind finish to nose out the University of Hawaii team by six points in the fourth and last meet of the championship series held last night at the university tank. The final score was 55-49.

The Army can rightly claim a great victory after entering the meet six points behind, and emerging victorious by outscoring the Rainbows by 12 points in the final events. Four of the fastest sprint swimmers in the Islands proved Army's margin of victory last night when Tannehill and Lake scored one-three in the 100-yard freestyle, and the relay squad of Lake, Timberlake, Waidlick, and Tannehill broke the Hawaiian championship record in winning the 400-yard relay event.

In the first event of the evening, Ed Alvarez, defending champion in the low board diving, led the field with 118.8 points. Rutherford of Roosevelt was second with 107.2 digits, while Snyder of the Army was third. After this event, the University and Army were tied at 34-all.

Lt. Ben Webster came through as expected to win the 150-yard backstroke event from Desha and Powers of the University. Harris of Forty-and-Eight led after the first 50 yards, but Webster forged ahead at the century mark, leading Desha by one yard. Webster piled up a good lead to win by eight yards.

TANNEHILL BEATS HURD

Charles "Tanglefoot" Tannehill pulled the biggest upset of the evening when he won the 100-yard freestyle event from Jimmy Hurd of the University in 55.8 seconds. Hurd led for the first 50 yards, being clocked in 26.2 seconds, but Tannehill forged ahead at the 75-yard mark and won out by inches. Lake of the Army was third, giving the Army a four-point lead after the running of this event.

With only four points margin over the University natators, the Sectorites had to win the 400-yard relay event to cop the meet. Lake gave the Army a three-yard lead in the relay, turning in a :36.6 effort for his 100 yards. Timberlake took up the Army cause and sported a four-yard lead at the 150-yard mark and increased the margin to five yards at the 200 mark. He was clocked in 57.8 seconds. Waidlick retained the lead, and was clocked in 57.6 when he passed the baton to Tannehill, Army anchor man. Tannehill and Hurd of the University battled it out, the former winning out by three yards in 56.2 seconds. The new record set by the Army quartet was 3:48.2, breaking the old mark by two-tenths of a second.

McALLISTER IN EXHIBITION

Second only to the Hawaiian championship events was the interest of the overflowing crowd in the diving exhibition of Bill McAllister, University of Hawaii student, who is ranked seventh among American divers. McAllister performed many sensational dives, both from the high board and tower, and won many rounds of applause.

At the end of the four-meet series, Jimmy Hurd of the Rainbows won individual scoring honors with 23 digits. Tannehill, with firsts in the 100, 220, and 500-yard freestyle championship events, and laps on various relay teams, was second in individual
