

# Expect Many Records Will Go In Rainbow Relay Meet

Trials for the 10th Rainbow Relay carnival Saturday at Kamehameha field are being held today, beginning at 4 p. m.

With the cream of Oahu's athletes competing, the 1934 meet is expected to eclipse all previous affairs. Records in practically every relay are doomed to be smashed.

In the trials today, the 100 yard dash novice has attracted 19 entries followed by 18 in the 220 yard hurdles. Eliminations will also be held in all field and pit events.
