

LARGE FIELD WILL VIE FOR HONORS IN HUI MAKANI COMPET

Maiola Kalili, Great Hawaiian Natator Just Returned
From Mainland to Show—Swimfest Is
Slated for May 28, 29, 30

MOST OF the leading swimmers of the territory are entered in the Hui Makani Outdoor swimming meet which will be held May 28, 29, 30 at the War Memorial Natatorium.

Entries closed late Thursday, and in all, nearly a hundred individual swimmers will vie for honors. Most of the natators have signed up for at least three events and indications are that one of the most colorful meets ever staged here will be presented for the approval of the exacting local fans.

What should be of great interest to the Honolulu swim fraternity is the fact that Maiola Kalili, great Hawaiian swimmer, who has been residing in Los Angeles the past few years is back home and will show in the forthcoming competition.

EVENTS ENTERED

Kalili is entered in the 100-meter backstroke open, 100-meter freestyle open, and the 400-meter freestyle open. He will also swim on the Hui Makani 300-meter medley and 800-meter relay teams.

Local fans will remember the great races Kalili swam against Buster Crabbe in the 400-meter freestyle a few years ago. The dusky Hawaiian youth first trimmed Crabbe in an important meet on the West Coast by the margin of a single stroke. The same year, the two were invited to show here and again Kalili triumphed in one of the greatest races ever seen at the War Memorial natatorium.

According to reports, Kalili is in good shape for the meet which will be held in the evening starting at 7:45 on Monday and Tuesday and in the morning at 10 o'clock on Wednesday which will be Memorial Day.

ANNUAL MILE SWIMS

In connection with the meet, the Star-Bulletin, on Decoration Day, will sponsor the annual mile swims, junior and senior, for men and the half-mile open for women.

Six clubs will be represented in the Hui Makani compet, they being, besides the sponsors, the Nuuanu Y, 49 and 8, Citywide A. A., Roosevelt and the Army.

Judging by the comments around town, much interest is being manifested in this meet. Indications are
