and was first named Buckingham. And the Buckingham's figurehead was regarded as a faithful likeness of the Queen.

Writing about her in an Eastern publication Harlan Trott notes that sailing records do not attribute any of those wraithsome qualities that made for dazzling speed and lightning passages. But the handiwork of woodcarver and naval designer endowed her with an arresting beauty that stirred the heart of many a deep-water seaman.

Poised under the bark's great steel bowsprit, the likeness of Queen Victoria tempered the massive surge and lift of the vessel's crashing bows with a restraining beauty, if the picture I saw of her recently means anything. Guided by this eager, leaning likeness, it was as though a queen was actually leading the great ship in her endless leaping from crest to crest.
