8 was third. The time was 1 minute, 17 seconds.

Later in the evening, Kalili won the 100-meter freestyle open with Hamada second and Furusho third. The race was close and Kalili emerged triumphant by less than two yards. Jimmy Hurd, of the University of Hawaii, finished fourth.

Eddie Alvarez of the Army won the springboard diving event with Rutherford of Roosevelt second and Greiner of the Army third.

Mildred Slight Hooper, of the Outrigger, captured the 200-meter breaststroke open for women in 3 minutes, 50.6 seconds. Jennie Woodd gave Mrs. Hooper a hard battle, finishing only several yards behind.

The Outrigger team, composed of Mildred Slight Hooper, Betty Stevenson, Gladys Slight and Olga Clarke, won the 400-meter open relay for women from the Citywide quartet by a goodly margin. The time was 5 minutes, 39 seconds.

Fujika of the Hui Makani won the 100-meter freestyle novice in 1 minute, 8.6 seconds and Dan Toomey of the same organization annexed first place in the 200-meter breaststroke novice.
