

Kalili Shines As Hui Makanis Lead In Swims

The Hui Makanis took a big lead last evening in the opening of the three day First Annual Hui Makani Outdoor swimming meet at the War Memorial Natatorium.

They scored 22 points, to be trailed by the Army with six. Roosevelt followed with three points and the 40 and 8 club came in with two. These were the results of the men's events.

In the women's events, the Outrigger Canoe club scored 16 points to lead the Citywide A. A., who tallied nine points.

There were eight events run off, but two of them were novice events and thus did not count in the official scoring.

A good sized crowd took in the show and saw the Hui Makanis take first place in five events. Outrigger garnered two first places, while the Army took the other first place.

No records were broken, but all the races were close affairs with the winners in the different events winning by one or more yards.

Maiola Kalili Shines

Maiola Kalili, famous Hawaiian swimmer, who had been showing on

the mainland and other parts of the globe, was the star of the evening when he won two events. They were 100 meters backstroke open and the 100 meters freestyle open.

In the backstroke he was given a hot race by Adolph Desha, winning by two yards. He was timed in at 1 minute and 17 seconds.

Kalili also won by two yards in the freestyle event from N. Hamada; his teammate. He was timed at 63.6 seconds.
