

Mile Swim At Waikiki This Morning

Events for Both Men and Women at War Me- morial Tank

IN conjunction with the Hui Makani outdoor swimming meet this morning at the War Memorial Natatorium, the Star-Bulletin will sponsor its annual distance swim for both men and women. The first race will start at 11 o'clock.

The mile swim for men is divided into two classes—junior and senior. The women's event will be half mile.

As a result of careful and well-planned-out training the past couple of months, all the entrants are in great shape and all set to answer the starter's gun.

Maurice Furusho of the Hui Makani is the defending champion in the senior class. He is entered in the race and judging by the great performance he made Monday night in the 1500-meter race, he should triumph again, but not without a hectic battle at the hands of Yoshikawa of the Nuuanu Y. Calosopa of the Citywide A. A., and Gilchiro Shiraki and E. Nakamura of the 40 and 8 club.

The junior class compet should also be hard fought. Vieing for honors will be Tai of the Citywide A. A., Michael Bray, unattached, and Shiraki and Nakamura of the 40 and 8.

A hectic race is promised when the women's half-mile event is staged. Outstanding among the entrants are Olga Clarke, Gladys Slaght and Mildred Slaght Hooper. The first named is favored to win. This trio is expected to receive high, heavy competition from Miss M. Morse of the Citywide, and Betty Stevenson of the Outrigger.
