

HUI MAKANIS

LEAD IN MEET

Coach Harvey Chilton's Hui Makanis swept everything before them with the exception of one lone point in the second night of the Hui Makani outdoor swimming meet last evening at the War Memorial natatorium.

The Makanis won all positions in the men's races with the exception of third place in the 400 meters freestyle when Nakamura of the 40 & 8 club finished third to garner one point.

In the opening night the Makanis gathered in 22 points and last night they scored 26, bringing their grand total up to 48. The Army is in second place with eight and Roosevelt and the 40 & 8 club are next with three points each.

O. C. C. Women Ahead

Outrigger is leading in the women's events, having garnered 16 points in the opening night and 14 points last night for a grand total of 30. Citywide scored four points last night to bring up its score to 13.

No records were broken last night but competition was keen throughout.

Maurice Furusho starred in the 400 meters freestyle open for men when he breezed down the home stretch, winner over his teammate, Nobori Hamada. His time was five minutes, 18 6-10 seconds.

It was a close race between the two all the way. Furusho grabbed the lead from the start and was pressed closely by Hamada and Maiola Kalili, the latter giving up at the 300 mark. Down the home stretch Furusho and Hamada put up a death struggle but Furusho had too much power in his system and won by two yards.

Olga Clarke, star Outrigger mermaid, was another brilliant performer of the evening when she won the 100 meters freestyle open for women in 1 minute
