

ORDER OF EVENTS ANNOUNCED FOR BIG RACES ON JULY 4TH

Eight Canoe Races, 25-Mile Outboard Motor Championship On Program To Be Presented On Ala Moana. Club To Give Dance On June 30

THE LIST of events for the regatta on the Ala Moana on the Fourth of July were completed yesterday by officials of the Outrigger, Hui Nalu and Queen's Surfriders clubs, sponsors of the program.

Eleven events will be staged including six canoe races for men, two for women and three heats of 8 1-3 miles each for the Outboard motor championship of the Islands.

The first race will take place at 9 o'clock and it is expected that the entire program will be over by noon.

ORDER OF EVENTS

The events in the order in which they will be run, follows:

1. First heat, Outboard motor championship, 8 1-3 miles.
2. Junior 4-paddle for men, $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile.
3. Senior 2-paddle for men, $\frac{1}{2}$ of a mile.
4. Junior 6-paddle for women, $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile.
5. Senior 6-paddle for men (blue ribbon event) $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile.
6. Second heat Outboard motor championship, 8 1-3 miles.
7. Junior 2-paddle for men, $\frac{1}{2}$ of a mile.
8. Senior 6-paddle for women, $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile.
9. Senior 4-paddle for men, $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile.
10. Junior 6-paddle for men, $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile.
11. Final heat, Outboard motor championship, 8 1-3 miles.

All races will be staged over a course laid out off Ala Moana park in full view of the spectators. A small admission will be charged, the receipts to be used to defray the expenses of the various crew to the annual Kona races.

CREWS IN HARD DRILLS

Outrigger, Hui Nalu and Queen's Surf coaches put their men through gruelling paces again last night and every day between now and July 4, they will get the same dosage. Everything in seriousness in the battle for various seats. Twenty-six members from each of the three big beach clubs will be taken to Kona and these seats will go to the best available men, the boys showing the most stuff that it take to make winning crews, in practice.

All crews are staging their workouts on the Ala Moana where the conditions are almost the same as in Kona.

DANCE JUNE 30

While the crews were going through their paces last night, the committee in charge of the big dance to be staged in the Outrigger pavilion the night of June 30, were completing arrangement for this gala event. Not a stone has been left unturned to make this a gay affair. The dance is being sponsored by the Outrigger, Hui Nalu and Queen's Surfriders clubs and tickets are available from members of the three clubs.
