Tigers And Yanks Win In A.L. Race

Senators Jump To Third
Place—Pirates,
Phils, Split

NEW YORK, June 26—The Yanks and Detroit Tigers both advanced their one-two positions in the American league today with spanking victories over the White Sox and Philadelphia Athletics, respectively.

The Washington Senators pulled up to third place, overhauling the high riding Red Sox, after nosing out the Browns while the Soxies floundered against Cleveland.

The Giants stumbled in the National league and lost to the St. Louis Cardinals. The Cubs gained a game on the league leaders with a win over the Brooklyn Dodgers.

The Boston Braves drubbed Cincinnati. The Phillies nosed out the Pittsburgh Pirates in the first game of a doubleheader and then lost a five inning nightcap, that had to be cut short because of rain and approaching darkness.

TIGERS TAKE ATHLETICS

PHILADELPHIA, June 26—Eldon Auker hurled the Detroit Tigers to a 4 to 1 victory over the Athletics today.

With entries closing on Saturday, the following had signed for the championship by yesterday:

Joe Santos, Percy Gray, Benny Lovell, Billy Lovell and Hugh Patten. Several other fearless drivers are expected to enter the race before the deadline at noon, Saturday.

CHAMPION ENTERED

Of the five early entrants, Joe Santos is probably the most prominent. Santos won the Island title several years ago by defeating a great boat.

For next Wednesday's races the championship will be decided in a series of three races of 8 1/3 miles each), Santos has a 50-horsepower Johnson motor all tuned up. The motor is capable of knocking off between 45 and 50 miles per hour. (Knots may be the nautical term, but I mean 50 miles per hour.)

Also driving a big motor, one capable of staying with Santos all the way, will be Benny Lovell, veteran driver, who will be using an Elto 40-horsepower. Billy Lovell will use an Elto 36 while Percy Gray, who is regarded as one of the most consistent finishers among local putt-putters, will drive a Johnson 32. The type of boat to be used by Patten is unknown.

The three Outboard events will be held at the start, middle and close of the regatta which will start at 11 o'clock and close at noon.

BIG TURNOUT EXPECTED

The committee in charge of the regatta is preparing to handle a crowd of several thousand next Wednesday. There is ample parking space for automobiles along the banks of the Ala Moana besides plenty of room for spectators to sit and view the entire race from start to finish. The regatta is being sponsored by the E. Nalu, Outrigger and Queen's Surfer canoe clubs. The program of canoe races will be the same as that which will be followed up in Kona on July 28.
