

KONA PADDLING RACES AUG. 4

Because of the big reception for President Roosevelt's visit, which will require all the outrigger canoes available, the annual paddling races at Kealahou bay, Kona, have been postponed from July 28 to August 4.

Announcement was made last evening at the practices being conducted by local clubs at the Moana park.

The week's postponement, however, will not affect plans for the preliminary regatta scheduled for July 4 at the Moana park channel, where all Oahu crews will compete.

Searle Coach

It was announced this morning that Theodore (Pump) Searle, graduate manager of the University of Hawaii athletics, and a member of the Hawaiian A. A. U. swimming committee, has been appointed coach of the Molokai crews by Paul Fagan, manager.

Molokai will be represented in every event at the Kona races. The crews are shaping up splendidly and expect to spring several surprises.

The famous Fagan canoe will be shipped to Honolulu within a few days. It will be re-rigged and lightened by George D. (Dad) Center, expert in outrigger canoes and in swimming.
