

# PADDLERS TO START 9 A. M.

## Besides Canoe Paddling There Will Be Outboards and a Barge Race

Spectacular finishes and fast times are expected to take place tomorrow morning at the Manoa park channel in the preliminary canoe paddling regatta to the big races on August 4 at Kealahou bay, Kona.

All the crews involved are reported in fine shape and the program, which commences at 9 o'clock, should be an interesting one.

The clubs vying for the day's laurels are the Outrigger Canoe club, champion last year at Kona; Hui Nalus and Queen's Surfriders. Coaches are George D. (Dad) Center, John D. Kaupiko Sr. and Willie Whittle.

Besides the canoe paddling, there will be three heats of outboard motorboat racing and a special barge event between a crew representing the Navy and one from the Myrtle club.

1. First heat, outboard motor championship, eight and a half miles.

2. Junior four paddle for men, seven eighths mile.

3. Senior two paddle for men, half mile.

4. Junior six paddle for women, seven eighths mile.

5. Senior six paddle for men (blue ribbon event), seven eighths mile.

6. Second heat outboard motor championship, eight and a half miles.

7. Junior two paddle for men, half mile.

8. Senior six paddle for women, seven eighths mile.

9. Senior four paddle for men, seven eighths mile.

10. Junior six paddle for men, seven eighths mile.

11. Final heat outboard motor championship, eight and a third miles.

Following are some of the directions the spectators have been asked to observe in order to aid putting over a successful program.

### Some Rules

Automobiles will be assessed 25 cents each. Each occupant or any one entering the grounds will pay 25 cents. To enter one of the bleacher seats, situated at the finish or at the waikiki end of the park, an additional 25 cents is charged.

There are three entrances, one at the ewa end, one at the waikiki end and one at the middle of the park.

To assist handling of tickets, an occupant of each car should get off—should there be a long line—to purchase the necessary tickets.

The committee announced that there is plenty of parking space inside but the early comers will get the best positions.

All contestants will be checked at the ewa gate.
