

Ala Moana Regatta Today Promises To Be Gala Festival

Canoe Clubs Primed To Go In Big Event This Morning; Outboarders Groom Motors For Championship; Myrtles, Navy Ready

HILO, July 3.—The grand parade Wednesday morning will mark the start of the celebration in Hilo of Fourth of July. Numerous units and bands will participate, the march beginning at 8:30 a. m.

A mutt show at Mooheau park starting at 10 a. m., baseball at Hoolulu park beginning at 1:30 p. m., tennis tournament at the new courts at Lincoln park starting at 4 p. m., a pageant, the Dance of All Nations, at Mooheau park beginning at 7 and street dancing beginning at 8:30 and continuing to midnight comprise the complete program for the day.

The parade marking the opening of the final day in the celebration is being handled by Lou Holzman, vice-commander of the American Legion, Hilo Post No. 3.

The marchers will start from Wai-anuenue avenue above Kapiolani street, proceed makai to Kamehameha avenue and then continue along Front street to the intersection at Piopio street to disband.

The reviewing stand will be located on Kamehameha avenue opposite Mooheau park.
