YALE AFTER THAMES CUP Yale is competing in the Thames cup, and has a four in the Wyfold cup for the first time. The only previous visit of Yale to Henley was in 1896, when they were beaten by Leander in the Grand Challenge cup. They are only the second foreign crew to compete in the Wyfolds. Christiana club in Norway being the first, in 1921.

Germany. Austria and Holland have pairs entered for the Silver Goblets, but none of them have contested this race before, and they may find difficulty in steering between the booms.

H. Buhtz, of Berlin, is entered for the Diamond Sculls, the world's premier trophy for scullers. This young German, who won in 1932, gave one of the most perfect exhibitions of sculling seen at Henley for years. He is fancied to win this year.

Against him is J. Zavrel, of Czechoslovakia, who reached the semi-finals last year, and W. Rutherford, of Princeton.

Chief of the British entries is the Leander club, which has an eight comprised of this year's Oxford and Cambridge crews. It is a strong favorite to win the Grand Challenge cup.

FAVORITE BRITISH CLUBS

London and Thames clubs are the next most important, and the remainder of the home competitors are made up by college crews from most of the universities in England, Scotland and Ireland.

The regatta is being held over one of the most beautiful stretches of the River Thames between the heavily wooded banks of Berkshire. The course is the famous "straight mile." considered one of the finest pleces of racing water in the world. In the dead water beyond the

In the dead water beyond the course are packed house-boats, punts and canoes filled with spectators. Providing the weather is fine, the racing is almost outdone in interest by the fashion displays, for Henley is regarded as the peak of the London season. It rivals Ascot as a free dress parade.
