

# Black and Golds Capture Blue Ribbon, Three Other Events

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Surfers were right on the heels of the O.C.C.'s. Vierra and Paul started out at a hectic clip, establishing a lead of close to a boat length at the half-way mark. They weakened at the finish and were nearly overtaken by Hollinger and Beckert who finished in a brilliant burst of speed.

Later in the day, Paul and Vierra came back to score a second triumph, rowing in the victorious Hui Nalu senior four which won by 50 yards from the Queen's Surfers who finished second. Outrigger was third, 25-yards behind the second boat, Malcolm Paoa and John D. Kaupiko, Jr., were the other members of the Hui Nalu crew.

In the junior six, Hui Nalu again won as she pleased, leading Outrigger across the line by an easy four lengths. Outrigger and the Queen's Surfers waged a bitter battle for second with Outrigger winning by less than a half length. Walter Love, Bill Broad, Andy Lambert, Squeeze Kamaana, Fred Wilhelm and Tom Kia-kona comprised the Hui Nalu crew.

In this junior event, the Hui Nalu crew made better time than their seniors. Both races were over  $\frac{3}{4}$  of a mile. The juniors negotiated the distance in 7:23:7-10 compared to 7:31:1 for the seniors.

## OUTRIGGER JUNIORS LEAD

Outrigger won the junior four by one and a half lengths over Hui Nalu who finished about the same distance ahead of the Queen's Surfers. Jacobson, Hemmings, Hustace and "Sally" Hale paddled for Outrigger. Hale later teamed with Ryan to give Outrigger their only other victory in the junior two. Outrigger won by a length over the Queen's Surfers who finished the same distance ahead of Hui Nalu.

The girls' senior six developed into a brilliant race between the Outrigger and Hui Nalus. Outrigger finally won by a little over a length.

In the junior event for girls, the Hui Nalus scored a decisive victory winning by a 100 yards from the first Outrigger crew. Both clubs entered two crews in this event. The Outrigger second crew finished third.

The juniors made much faster time than the seniors. Time for the junior girls' event was 9:36:1 compared to 9:48:7 for the seniors.

Navy had little trouble winning from the Myrtle in the two barge races. In training for some time, the sailors showed excellent form against the Myrtle oarsmen who rowed with but one brief workout Tuesday night.
