

Canoes to Meet President When Houston Arrives

Six Hawaiian Paddlers in Each to Wear Full Regalia

Thirteen outrigger canoes manned by six Hawaiian paddlers, each clad in ahuulas (capas), will greet President Roosevelt off Honolulu harbor when he arrives aboard the USS Houston on July 26, it was announced yesterday after a conference at the city hall attended by Mayor Fred Wright, Supervisor Manuel C. Pacheco, George D. ("Dad") Center, Dan Kaupiko and Lang Akana.

The fleet of canoes will be led by a large double canoe, on the platform of which it is planned to have Duke Kahanamoku take the part of King Kamehameha.

FULL REGALIA

At the wharf members of various Hawaiian societies clad in full regalia will be on hand to welcome the President.

Plans are also being made for a Hawaiian entertainment to be given at Washington place by the governor. A. W. Heen, secretary of the liquor commission, has been appointed to make arrangements for this entertainment.

The board of supervisors will invite the President to a dinner in his honor to be held possibly at the Wai'alae Country club.
