

# HUI NALU-OUTRIGGER TO BE REPRESENTED ON KEALAKEKUA BAY

Fifteen Girl Paddlers to Be Accommodated for at  
Kona—August 4 Is Date of Big  
Canoe Classic

THE KONA canoe regatta on the blue waters of Kealakekua Bay, August 4, will not be without one of its favorite events, the girls' race. Definite arrangements for crews from the Outrigger and Hui Nalu clubs to go to Hawaii to meet the husky Kona girls, were made yesterday, following receipt of word from Kona officials that accommodations were available for 15 girls from Honolulu.

For a time it was feared that the girls' event would be deleted from the program or confined to competition among Kona girls alone.

News that they could make the trip, was received with great enthusiasm by the local girls yesterday. They have been working long and hard in hopes that room would be made for them both on boat and land.

## SAIL AUGUST 2

According to instructions received yesterday, the girls will leave Honolulu on Thursday, August 2, arriving in Hawaii waters in time for one good workout before matching their prowess against the maidens of Kona. The Hui Nalus and Outriggers will be allowed one crew and one substitute each. A chaperone will complete the party of 15.

Kona will have three crews to send against the Honolulu girls. Molokai is also reported to have a girls' crew but arrangements have not definitely been made for them at Kona.

## 78 MEN

Seventy-eight rugged paddlers from the Outrigger, Hui Nalu and Queen's Surfers clubs will carry the banner of Oahu in the men's events. Twenty-six will be sent from each club. The Outrigger and Hui Nalu seniors will leave on the Humuhumu on July 30 to take up camp at Keahebe. The remainder will leave on the Coast Guard Cutter Itasca at 8 a. m. July 31. The Itasca will go to Keunakakai to pick up the 16 members of the Molokai crews before proceeding to Kona. This schedule affords all crews plenty of time for training before the races.

## FINE VIEW OF FINISH

Another announcement made by regatta officials concerns the fine planning to make the Kona trip. Every effort has been made to afford the best possible view of the races. Those witnessing the events from Inter-Island boats and pleasure craft will have one of the best views as arrangements have been completed to anchor these boats much closer to the finish line than last year and parallel to the course.

Commander John Baylis of the Itasca will set the course next week when the Coast Guard cutter goes to Kona to meet the President.

A number of the yachts in the trans-Pacific race are expected to cruise to the Kona coast for the occasion.
