

PAUL FAGAN BACKING ENTRIES; NAVY WILL SEND BOATS TO KONA

'Pump' Searle Coaches Kaunakakai Paddlers—Oahu Entries for Classic Regatta Total 78—
Itasca Will Transport Teams

MOLOKAI will be represented in the Kona canoe regatta on August 4 by 20 husky paddlers, recruited from the "wilds" in and around Kaunakakai. The Molokai contingent is backed by Paul Fagan, noted capitalist and Molokai rancher, and is coached by "Pump" Searle.

The Kaunakakai paddlers will depart for Kona aboard Cmdr. Jack Baylis' coast guard cutter Itasca. The Itasca will leave here at 6 a.m. on July 31, picking up the Molokai crews in Kaunakakai around 10 a.m. Arrived in Kona, the Molokaians will camp with the local Honolulu crews at Keauhou.

NAVY BOATS TO KONA

It was announced yesterday by Capt. Ralph Koch, commander of submarine squadron four, that the navy will send the USS Beaver and eight submarines to lend color to the regatta. The navy boats will arrive off Kona on August 3. After the races on the 4th, liberty will be in order for the bluejackets who will go ashore to see the pageant at Kailua.

Honolulu coaches of the Hui Nalu, Outrigger, and Queen's Surf clubs will announce the personnel of their crew within the next few days. Hui Nalu and Outrigger clubs are sending both kane and wahine crews.

Oahu participants in the regatta will total 78. The Outrigger and Hui Nalu senior paddlers will leave Honolulu July 30 on the Humuula.

Although most of the accommodations for passage to Kona for the races have been filled, more vacationers will be able to see the races via excursion boat and private craft.

This year's regatta will be the greatest water classic of its kind in Island history. Not a stone has been left unturned by race officials to make an extravaganza in every sense of the word. And while Kona is bending every effort to make this an outstanding event in the lives of the spectators, at the same time they are preparing to make things miserable for the visiting paddlers when they answer the starter's gun the morning of the fourth. Great crews will be carrying the banner of Kona in the races and local and Molokai crews can start now to prepare for real tests.
