

SIX BOATLOADS TO MAKE TRIP

Gay Harris Now Coach of O. C. C.s; Hui Nalu Line- ups Also Revealed

Gay Harris, head coach of the Outrigger Canoe club crews which will go to Kona August 4 to compete with the best in the islands, today announced his lineups.

Harris, who replaced George (Dad) Center because the latter could not devote time to the training of the canoe paddlers, stated that the Outriggers are confident of making a fine showing.

"We realize," Coach Harris said, "the other clubs have strong entries. We won the bulk of honors in the last regatta but much of our material is scattered this year. The keenest kind of competition should be witnessed."

Five Men Crews

The O. C. C.s will send 24 paddlers to the Kealahou bay races. Accompanying the 18 men and six women will be Coach Harris and his assistant, "Dad" Center, and a chaperon who is to be selected.

Five men crews and a women boatload are representing the Outriggers.

The senior men six will depart on the Humuula on July 30 while the other four men crews leave on the Itasca on July 31.

Three more hard practices are listed for the men paddlers while the women rowers will taper off next Wednesday.

Coach Harris reported that his crews are in first class condition and that there will be no change in the lineups unless the unforeseen happens.
