Special Steamer Trip

The SS Waialeale will arrive at Napoopoo at 8:30 a. m. tomorrow. The vessel will anchor in Kealakekua Bay close to the lanes followed by the race canoes.

A picnic luncheon for passengers will be held at 11:30 a. m., the passengers disembarking in the steamer's boats and landing at Kaawaloa (Cook's monument), where luncheon will be served by stewards.

At 1 p. m., the passengers will ride in boats across the bay to Napoopoo landing where they will enter automobiles and drive to Honaunau—City of Refuge. The drive will continue along the upper road through Kealakekua to Huehue, across the 1801 flow and to Puuwaa-waa, returning to Huehue and Kailua.

An Hawaiian luau will be held at the pavilion in the Kailua palace grounds at 6:45 p. m., followed by an Hawaiian pageant on Kailua beach in front of the hotel at 8 p. m.

A public dance is scheduled for 9 p. m. at Kona Inn.

Between 2 p. m. and 3 p. m. Saturday, Kona citizens will gather at the Konawaena school grounds for a unique program which will feature, in addition to a rounded program, cadence drills and manual of arms by the Hilo police force headed by Capt. William Martin, Lt. William Kualii, and Officer Charles J. Warren.

A flower show will be held at the school grounds during the program.
