

# Listen In On Races Today

The second annual canoe paddling championship tournament at Kealakekua Bay, Hawaii, will be broadcast from the opening gun to the final event over radio station KGU this morning.

Control will be transferred from Honolulu to Kealakekua Bay at 8:45 this morning. The broadcast is expected to last for three hours.

KGU will cover the event from a specially built platform near the historic heiau near the finish line and from a speedboat especially equipped with a portable radio telephone. A general description of the crowd and the races will be sent out from the main stand.

The speedboat will follow each race and give a more accurate description of the progress of each crew than it has been possible to give in similar events in the past. Webley Edwards and Don Crozier of KGU will be at the microphones. The broadcast is sponsored by the Associated Oil Company.

Tonight from 8 to 9 o'clock, KGU will set up its remote control equipment in the beautiful seaside lawn of the Kona Inn to cover the pageant that has become a regular feature of that hostelry's part in entertaining visitors to the races.

Old Hawaiians from the Kona Coast, maintaining the customs, traditions, and fine old music of their forebears, will be heard in songs and chants seldom heard in Honolulu. This broadcast is available to listeners throughout the Territory through sponsorship of the Inter-Island Steam Navigation Company.
