## RACE OF DAY

**Umbrellas and Raincoats In Demand as Jupe Pluvius Attends Regatta**

**Shores of Historic Bay are Lined With Thousands as Celebration Starts**

Cloud-draped skies and drizzling rain greeted spectators which lined the decks of several ships which found anchorage in historic Kealahou Bay to await the start of the second annual canoe races.

The Inter-Island steamer *Waialeale* arrived shortly after 3 a. m. thronged to the top deck with a capacity list of Honolulu people. Other ships in the harbor included the Coast Guard Cutter *Itasca* which arrived earlier during the week with members of the Honolulu and Molokai crews, the *Waiatamba*, one of the trans-Pacific yachts, the USS *Beaver*, and four submarines from Pearl Harbor, the large *Argonaut*, the S-31, S-33, and S-35.

### Raincoats Needed

Rush calls for raincoats and umbrellas were heard along the beach as spectators who lined the shores from Napoopoo landing to the sandy Napoopoo beach hurried for shelter.

### Kailua First

Julian R. Yates' Kailua junior paddlers registered the first upset of the canoe races by leading the

### CANOE RESULTS

Results of the Canoe races staged at Kealahou Bay today were as follows:

Junior Six Paddle—Won by Kailua, Outrigger C. C. second.

Open Two Paddle—Won by Kailua. (Hui Nalu finished first, but was disqualified for steering off the course.)

Senior Six Paddle—Won by Kailua, Honaunau second, Outrigger third.

Junior Four Paddle—Tie between Kailua and Outrigger, Honaunau second, Napoopoo third.

Women's Six Paddle—Won by Outrigger, Kailua second, Honaunau third.

Favored Outrigger Canoe Club Junior paddlers to the finish line in the opening event.

The Outriggers finished a length and a half behind, as the result of steering off the course on the home stretch.

Hui Nalu won the open two-paddle in easy style, leading Kailua, who finished second, by 300 feet. But the judges decided to disqualify Hui Nalu for finishing in the wrong lane.

### Cop Classic

Kailua repeated their victory in the junior paddle by winning the classic of the day, the senior six-paddle event. Kailua finished the course in 18 min. and 15 sec., a quarter of a length ahead of Honaunau, which led the Outrigger paddlers by a half length.

The junior four paddle was declared an official tie between Kailua and Outrigger. To observers on shore, it appeared that Kailua had the edge. Honaunau finished second in this race and Napoopoo was third.

The Kailua paddlers forged to the front in the role of dark-horses, and evidenced complete mastery of the situation. Ernest Cooke coached the Kailua crews.

### Wrong Lane

Judges disqualified Hui Nalu in the open two-paddle because the
