

THE STAR-BULLETIN CONGRATULATES TODAY--

Joseph Rider Farrington, general manager of The Star-Bulletin, who is 37 years old today.

Born October 15, 1897, the son of Wallace Rider and Catherine Mc-Alpine (Crane) Farrington. Mr. Farrington was graduated from Punahou in 1915 with honors, and in 1919 completed a course in journalism at the University of Wisconsin with the degree of A. B.

In 1919 he joined the staff of the Philadelphia Public Ledger and in 1920 was assigned to the Washington bureau of that newspaper, where he remained until the fall of 1923 when he returned to Honolulu to become managing editor of The Star-Bulletin.

His father, Wallace Rider Farrington, was the sixth governor of the territory.

Mr. Farrington was nominated as a Republican candidate for senator at the recent primary. He is a member and director of the Honolulu Chamber of Commerce, the American Legion, Honolulu Advertising club and the Beta Theta Pi fraternity, past president and life member of the Outrigger Canoe club and a former member of the territorial boxing commission.
