

# SECOND HAWAIIAN TITLE MEET SLATED FOR THIS EVENING

300-Meter Individual Medley for Men Is Blue Ribbon Event—Hui Makani, Army Resume Battle For Local Outdoor Swim Supremacy

WITH THE staging of the second meet tonight in the War Memorial natorium, the struggle for the Hawaiian A. A. U. outdoor swimming supremacy between the Hui Makani and the Army, the outstanding contenders, will be resumed.

At current calculations, the Makanis are setting the pace with eight points to seven for the Sectorites. The University of Hawaii, 40 and 8 club, Nuuanu Y and the Citywide A. A. have not as yet scored a single point in the championship events.

BILL WISE, the sage of Kalihi, will release his Thundering Herd from Kamehameha School on Kam Field Saturday afternoon, but whether they can trample on the invading St. Louis college eleven from Kalaepohaku as they did the Rough Riders several weeks ago, remains to be seen.

The prep school grid battle is scheduled to start at 3 o'clock.

Since their defeat at the hands of Punahou, the Saints have been practicing hard and reports have it that they will not be such easy victims for an air attack in the coming game as they were against the Buffanblus.

And if they are to stop the Warriors, they must perfect their defense against raids from the air, for that is the department in which the Kamehameha eleven is truly powerful and most efficient.

### FINE PASSER

In Charlie Mahoe the Kalihi boys have the best passer in the league. Mahoe not only shoots his passes with bullet velocity but also tosses them with such accuracy that unless it is knocked down by the defensive players it cannot help but nestle in the arms

Only one titular event for men is slated to be staged in this evening's aqua-fest, which will start promptly at 7:30. It is the 300-meter individual medley, and signed up for the race are the leading natators of the Hui Makani, Army and the University.

Maurice Furusho, veteran Japanese star, who last week won the 1500-meter freestyle swim; Noboru Hamada, an equally brilliant swimmer, and Barney Pung, brother of the late Charlie Pung, former backstroke champion of Hawaii and one time Olympic representative of the United States, who has been improving with rapid strides since his initiation in the game about a year ago, will carry the colors of the Hui Makani club into the medley event.

### FORMIDABLE NATATORS

All three of them are formidable swimmers and capable of registering fast times. However, whether or not they will be able to outdistance the great army trio of Van Winkle, Bill Waidlich and Lt. Ben Webster remains to be seen. In the pink of condition as a result of the recent Sector meets, Uncle Sam's boys will be at their best and hard to beat.

Furthermore, they are tried and experienced swimmers and this factor will stand them in good stead.

Adolph Desha, lanky natator from Hilo, will represent the University of Hawaii in this titular event and if the fine showing he made in the indoor meet in March is to be taken as a criterion of his ability, he will make a formidable challenge for one of the three point positions.

This event should prove to be the closest and most interesting race of the entire four-night competition.
