

BIG MEET AT NATATORIUM

Miss Olga Clark Favored To Win 800 and 100 Meter Events From Rivals

Three Hawaiian championship events will dominate the second of the series of four Hawaiian Outdoor swimming championship meets each Friday evening at the War Memorial natatorium.

Tonight's program features the 800 meter freestyle open swim for women, the second race of the evening and the first of the trio of championship swims.

In this swim are entered the cream of Hawaii's mermaids: Heading the list is none other than the most outstanding girl swimmer of Hawaii at the present time, Olga Clark, representing the Outrigger Canoe club

She rules as a favorite to cop the race, one which has been her best in the past years. Gladys Slaght, also of the OCC, is another competitor who bears watching in this grind.

The rest of the field includes Jean Pope, OCC; Margaret Morse, CWAA, and R. Howland, U. of H.

Another Feature

The second Hawaiian championship race, the seventh on the program, is the 100 meter backstroke open for women. In this race such swimmers as Olga Clark, Gladys Slaght, Mildred Slaght Hooper, B. Stevenson and A. Delancey of the OCC, M. Karratti of the CWAA, V. Lewis of the 40 and 8, and R. Howland of the U. of H. will grace the starting line.

Here is also represented the best possible. Again Olga Clark, who is an all around swimmer of exceptional stamina and ability, is a serious contender. Mildred Slaght Hooper, the sister of Gladys, must also be counted on to give Miss Clark opposition.

Medley For Men

The final race in which a Hawaiian championship is at stake is the ninth event of the night, the 300 meter individual medley open for men. Action galore is expected in this water splurge as several good men are found among the three entered teams.

Hui Makani's hopes will rest on three of their best aquatic stars. They are N. Hamada, Maurice Furusho and the up and coming Barney Pung, youngest of a family of well known swimmers.

Army's hopes lie with W. Waldlich, B. Webster and C. Van Winkle. A group that is not to be taken too lightly is this trio of service men. Army is a threat to register a possible grand slam in this event.

University of Hawaii has but one entrant, A. Desha. A Hilo boy, Desha is a swimmer who has stamina and powerful stroker

Should Be Close

Another promising race for the evening will be the 50 meter freestyle open for men. Qualifiers in this race include M. Furusho and N. Hamada of Hui Makani, C. Tannehill, W. Waldlich and W. Lake of the Army, and R. Arizumi of the 40 and 8 and E. Scott of the University.

Here again Army has a trio of its best and reign as favorites to cop the race. Hui Makani has two very efficient men in Furusho and Hamada. A battle to the finish should ensue in this short, fast race.

The 100 meter freestyle novice for men should also be another good race to watch as a host of young up and coming swimmers are competing. A good crowd is expected.
