CAPTURES 800 AND 300 RACES

Noboru Hamada Upsets Dope By Taking Furusho Down In Featured Medley

Olga Clark, peer of all local mermaids, displayed her ability at the Waikiki Memorial natatorium last night when she copped two Hawaiian open women's swimming championships in impressive style.

She won the 800 meter freestyle women's event in 13 minutes and 18 seconds and came back later to win the 100 meter open women's backstroke event in 1 minute 26 2-5 seconds.

Miss Clark had no difficulty at all in the 800 meter event. She set a tremendous pace right from the start and when she reached the finish line she was fully 45 yards ahead of Rachael Howland of the University of Hawaii. The race proved once and for all Miss Clark's superiority over her contemporaries.

She appeared in fine shape, as she later came back and gave a great display in the 100 meter backstroke event, winning by a good margin.

Great Race

One of the greatest races of the evening resulted in a victory for Noboru Hamada, Hui Makani star, in the 300 meter medley Hawaiian championship race.

Hamada opened up with a terrific burst of speed in the home stretch to defeat Maurice Furusho, one of the best in these parts.

Adolph Desha, university star, took the lead at the start in the breaststroke event, but his lead was cut quite a bit in the backstroke heat although he still held the lead.

However, in the home stretch and freestyle heat, Desha fell back as Hamada, Furusho and Diamond Martin finished ahead of him in that order.

The time was 4 minutes 20 3-5 seconds. The fans certainly got their money's worth in this race.

Hui Makani's Gain

All three winners of this last race were from the Hui Makani, which certainly had a great night. It increased its lead after last night's championship events 17-7 over the Service team.

Another stirring race of the evening was the 400 meter men's junior relay event, which the Army won in a hectic battle from the 40 & 8 club.

In the first two heats the Army was in third place, but Hanes, swimming number three, made up for lost ground, and in the home stretch Jensen came down the watery path like a fish and won from the 40 & 8 anchor man by five yards. The time was 4 minutes 36 1-5 seconds.

Another great race of the evening resulted in a win for Bill Lake of the Army over Waidlich of the same team in the 50 meter freestyle open men's event. In fact, so close was this race that the judges had a problem in making the decision. His time was 27 3-5 seconds.

The other events were also interesting, although a few did not cause any commotion. Next Friday evening
