

# THIRD TITULAR MEET ON TAP TOMORROW IN WAR MEMORIAL POOL

Five Championship Events Slated — Hui Makani Leads Race for Team Championship — 400-Meter Freestyle and Breaststroke Slated

Buck Jones, famous movie actor, has accepted an invitation to attend the third meet of the Hawaiian A. A. U. Outdoor swimming championships this Friday evening at the War Memorial Natatorium, it was announced yesterday.

The invitation was extended by Knute Cottrell, superintendent at the natatorium.

There will also be diving exhibitions by Eddie Alvarez, Larry Snyder and Art Rutherford.

**S**WIMMERS representing the Army, Hui Makani, University of Hawaii, 40 and 8, and other organizations which are entered in the annual Hawaiian A. A. U. Outdoor swimming championships staged their final hard practice sessions yesterday and as they emerged from their respective workouts, they appeared to be in the pink of condition.

Today they will go through light workouts to limber up their muscles in preparation for the third meet of a series of four, which will be held in the War Memorial natatorium tomorrow night.

Five championship events are slated for the impending meet and they are the three-meter board diving, 300-meter individual medley, and 100-meter freestyle for women and 400-meter breaststroke and 400-meter freestyle for men.

Two trophies are being competed for in this outdoor meet. One of them will be awarded to the team scoring the most points in the championship events and the other for the team registering the most digits in the non-title events, exclusive of races in which there is age limit.

## HUI MAKANI LEADS

The Hui Makani is leading the field in the struggle for both trophies. In the championship class, Harvey Chikton's boys are in the van with 17 points. Army has seven digits and unattached contestants have annexed three points.

In the non-title division, the Hui Makani is setting the pace also, but the margin of its lead is so narrow that it is negligible. According to the figures released yesterday by Theodore "Pump" Searle, in charge of the meet, the Makanis have 48 points, the army 45, the 40 and 8 club 18, University of Hawaii '8, Nuuanu Y. I. and unattached 5.

There are two more meets remaining and the rival clubs are looked for to launch a bitter fight for points in the forthcoming races.

Because of the fact that the Hui Makanis and the Army are the only teams that have scored points in the championship events, interest in the team titular battle has centered on them, but with the staging of the 400-meter breaststroke, the University of Hawaii is expected to start fighting in the points.

Adolph Desha is the hope of the University of Hawaii. In practice he has been making fine time and his team mates and the students at the Rainbow institution are confident that he will win either first or second place.

**S**TRIKING hard and fast in the third quarter to score a touchdown in six plays from their own 32-yard mark, the Leilehua Mules defeated McKinley, 7 to 0, yesterday at McKinley field to keep their record in the Junior Scholastic league unblemished.
