

SWIMMERS PREPARED FOR TRIALS TONIGHT IN MEMORIAL POOL

Five Championship Events Slated in Final Meet of
Hawaiian A. A. U. Outdoor Championships—
Spectacular Races Anticipated

WITH prospects of it being replete with spectacular and spine-tickling races bright, the fourth and final meet of the annual Hawaiian A. A. U. Outdoor swimming championships, sponsored by the Associated Students of the University of Hawaii, will be staged Friday night in the War Memorial tank.

Five championship events, including platform diving, 200-meter backstroke, 100 meter freestyle and 800-meter freestyle relay for men and 800-meter freestyle relay for women, will be held.

Open Water Swim Slated For Nov. 29

Students at University to
Sponsor Event at
Waikiki

THE Associated Students of the University of Hawaii will sponsor an open water swim on the morning of Thanksgiving Day, November 29, at Waikiki, it was announced yesterday.

With the different races, ranging from several hundred yards to one and a quarter mile, starting at various points, the finish will be in front of the Royal Hawaiian hotel.

The open water swim was held annually by the Outrigger Canoe club for members only, previously, but this year the University of Hawaii, which staged a similar compet in conjunction with the O. C. C. in 1933, will sponsor the event with the understanding that any swimmer will be allowed to compete.

INTERESTED IN SWIMMING

The students at the University of Hawaii have taken a sweeping interest in swimming and has contributed materially towards its development. Early this year, they sponsored the A. A. U. Indoor championships and presently the outdoor championships are being run by them.

In the open water swim there will be events for both men and women.

The blue ribbon event for men will be the one and quarter mile swim which will start at Castle Surfs outside the Elks club, and that for the women will be half mile for women. The latter event will start in front of Public Baths. The men's half mile swim will get underway at the same spot.

Cunha's Surf will be the taking-off point for the women junior race.

The novice races for both men and women will start at Canoe Surf.

Trophies will be presented to the winning men team and also to the victorious women team.

And for swimmers finishing in the first three places regular A. A. U. medals will be awarded.

TRIALS TONIGHT

Due to more than twelve entries in some of the events, trials will be staged this evening in the Natatorium. The events in which preliminary heats are necessary are the 50-meter freestyle novice for women, 200-meter backstroke Hawaiian championship, 500-meter freestyle junior, 100-meter freestyle Hawaiian championship, and 300-meter individual medley novice for men.

In the 200-meter backstroke and 100-meter freestyle championship events, the best sprint natators of the Hawaiian Islands will compete for honors.

The dorsal event will find Lt. Ben Webster, Green and Davis of the army competing against Hamada, Furusho, Pung, Martin and young Thiim of Hui Makani, Desha of the University of Hawaii, A. Kamoi of the Nuuanu Y, and Kanoa, Kiko, Russell, Taira and Kapua Harris for places in the finals when the trials are staged this evening.

An equally brilliant field will be seen vying to qualify for the finals in the century sprint freestyle.

GREAT SWIMMERS

In Bill Lake, the army will have a representative who is fast coming to a point where he will be the best sprint swimmer in the islands. Then too there will be "Tanglefoot" Tannehill, Raynor, Waidlich, Harsborne, and a newcomer named Jansen who shows much promise.

To match this great array of army natators, the Hui Makani will have Freeland, Hamada, Martin, Pung and Furusho. Arizumi, the Sakamoto brothers, and Spencer of the 40 and 8 are slouches, either, and they will bear watching as will C. Blaylock, unattached; Scott of the University of Hawaii and J. Calasopa of the Citywide.
