

# Big A.A.U. Natl. Swims For Hawaii

Champions Anxious to  
Come Here for Com-  
pets Next Year

**T**HE ADVERTISER has been advised from a reliable source that overtures have already been made by the Swimming Committee of the National A. A. U. to officials of the Hawaiian A. A. U. to stage the 1935 Men's National swimming championships in the War Memorial pool at Waikiki.

Mainland swimming champs have asked their representatives to see if something cannot be done about this during the annual meeting of the A. A. U. governing body in Miami this month.

In order to underwrite the event, Hawaii would be obliged to guarantee expenses for champions, and the total amount would be about \$3,000, possibly a little more.

This matter will be discussed at the December meeting of the Hawaiian A. A. U. and it is just possible that some action will be taken.

At the Nuuanu Y yesterday, the swimming committee of the Hawaiian A. A. U. met to hear a protest from from Hui Makani in connection with one of the races staged recently as part of the Outrigger open water swim carnival.

The protest will be submitted in writing and dis-
