Searle is presently selecting officials to handle the races. Al Simmons, major league baseball star, has been selected as starter and George Dad Center as referee.

The open water swims were formerly held exclusively for members of the Outrigger Canoe club, but this year with the Associated Students of the University of Hawaii sponsoring, they have been thrown open to all entries. Consequently, the largest field in history is looked for to compete in the races.

Members of the Outrigger Canoe club, Hui Makani, Army, University of Hawaii, and other organizations are expected to go over the course in practice swims this morning. Some of them swam over the course last Sunday.
