

MANY NATATORS SHOW THURSDAY

Field of 76 Swimmers Sign For Turkey Day Event; Many Clubs Represented

When entries closed yesterday, 76 natators had registered with Theodore Searle, University of Hawaii swimming coach, for the Waikiki open water swimming meet scheduled for Thanksgiving Day.

The Turkey Day swim, although sponsored by the University of Hawaii and held under AAU rules, is open to all who are interested, novices as well as experts. Consequently one of the largest field of contestants in the history of local swimming has signed for the events.

Members of many sporting clubs and beach clubs, as well as University athletes, will splash it out for trophies donated by the Royal Hawaiian hotel.

Included in the entries are A. E. Minville Jr., several times winner of the men's open events in the past; the Hui Makani stars, Maurice Furusho, Noburo Hamada and Diamond Martin; among the women are Olga Clarke, Mildred Hooper, Gladys Slaght and others.

Three Divisions

The schedule of events has been divided into senior, junior and novice races for men and women separately. All races will end directly in front of the Royal Hawaiian hotel, but starting points will vary.

Seniors will start at Castle surf off the Elks club, juniors will start at the public baths and novices will start at the canoe surfs.

Last Year's Records

In last year's collegiate competition the following unofficial records were established for the same course:

Senior swim for men, won by James Hurd, 30 min., 38 sec.

Senior swim for women, won by Olga Clarke, 19 min., 45 sec.

Junior swim for men, won by K. Kuramoto, 19 min., 24.4 sec.

Novice swim for men, won by J. Murakami, 12 min., 42.9 sec.

Novice swim for women, Rachel Howland and Lapana Furtado tied for first with times of 13 min., 20.3 sec.

There was no entry for the novice swim for women.

With the general interest in this year's events calling forth some of the best swimming talent in the islands, Coach Searle said he expected the records would be broken.

Start at 9 A. M.

According to Searle, the races will start promptly at 9 a. m., but all entries are requested to be at the Outrigger Canoe club by 8:30, to be checked and taken to their respective starting points.
