

OCC MERMAIDS TAKE HONORS

Sakamoto, Stewart, Pung
Win Men's Events; Race
Under AAU Rules

Natators from the Outrigger Canoe club and the 40 and 8 club swam off with two silver cups donated by the Royal Hawaiian hotel as major trophies for the Thanksgiving Day open swimming meet, sponsored yesterday at Waikiki under AAU rules by the associated students of the University of Hawaii.

Gliding through a smooth surf and pelted from above by an occasional drizzle from a dismal sky, Olga Clark won the featured women's open race and The Star-Bulletin trophy.

She and her fellow mermaids won first place in team standings for OCC by taking 10 out of a possible 12 places.

Men's races resulted in keener competition. H. Sakamoto and O. Stewart, representing the 40 and 8 club, took first in the men's open and men's novice events respectively.

Their efforts were aided by A. E. Minvielle Jr. and F. Tanaka, who won second places in the open and the novice events, to boost the 40 and 8 club's total to 45 points and first place among the men's teams.

Barney Pung's win in the men's open helped his teammates of the Hui Makani club gather a total of 34 points and take second place in the men's wimming.
