

CLIFF MELIM OFFERS PRIZES FOR 50-DASH ON A. A. U. PROGRAM

T. "Cliff" Melim of the Melim Service & Supply Co. has come along with an unusual suggestion. "Cliff" was a sprinter of real ability a number of years back, at one time holding many of the sprint records in the Territory. Back in 1918, when competing under the Outrigger Canoe Club's colors, he broke the 50-yard sprint record with the time of 5 1/5 seconds at Alexander Field, Punahou. Prior to this it had stood for about fifteen years, being held all this time by Chas. En Sue. "Cliff's" record stands to this day, and he now offers a special inducement to present-day sprinters to break it. He has asked that this

event be re-instated in the A.A.U. track program for this year and has offered the usual set of official A.A.U. medals for first, second and third place winners in this 50-yard event. He goes further to offer a special trophy in addition if his record is broken.

"Pump" Searle, representing the University of Hawaii Alumni Association, who are going to handle this year's meet, has accepted the offer gladly and will place this event on the program as a special attraction. And "Cliff" adds: "I'll be right on hand to extend the palm to the winner."
