

# Capt Timberlake Going to School; Leaves In April

## Outrigger Canoe Club Prexy to General Staff School

According to orders received at headquarters, Ft. Shafter, the 64th Coast Artillery (AA) will lose one of its most popular battery commanders when Capt. E. W. Timberlake, commanding Battery "G," sails for a trip around the world on April 26, prior reporting as a student for the 1935-36 course at the Command and General Staff school, Ft. Leavenworth, Kansas.

Using one of the jovial captain's pet expressions, "G troop" has been outstanding in inter-battery athletic competition. Last year his battery won the Col. Richard H. Williams athletic supremacy trophy, having cleaned up in volley ball, baseball and track during the past two years.

His battery was also instrumental in helping the Second Battalion win the inter-batter swimming meet, alst season.

### FROM MILITARY FAMILY

Capt. Timberlake comes from a family known throughout the army. His father, Col. Edward J. Timberlake, retired, formerly served in the islands, while his younger brother, Lt. Edward J. Timberlake, Jr., was formerly swimming star and coach at Luke Field, before sailing for Randolph Field Field last fall. Still another brother, Patrick W. Timberlake, received his commission upon graduation from West Point, but resigned to try the civilian field.

Back in the days when Scotty Schuman and several other local business men were attending Punahou Academy, the present Capt. Timberlake was a classmate.

When the Outrigger Canoe Club was reorganized last year, Capt. Timberlake was elected president of this widely known Hawaiian institution.

Capt. and Mrs. Timberlake will sail by commercial liner, visiting the Orient, Suez Canal and Europe reporting for duty at his new station.
