

Swim Trials This Evening In U. H. Tank

First Meet Of Indoor Championships On Tap Friday

IN PREPARATION for the first meet of the annual Hawaiian Indoor swimming championships slated for Friday evening, trials will be held in the University of Hawaii tanks tonight.

Preliminary heats are necessary in every event in which there are more than six entries, as there are only six lanes to the pool.

Entries closed last Saturday and registered are swimmers from the Palama Settlement, Andrew Cox School, 40 and 8, Nuuanu Y, Central Y, University of Hawaii, Citywide, Outrigger Canoe club, Roosevelt High and quite a few unattached performers. One Army natator has signed up, he being Elwin O. Dable, who is a backstroker and also a distance swimmer.

Races for both men and women will be staged in this meet, with open and junior championship events equally distributed over the four meets, one of which will be held every Friday night of this month.

All the swimmers entered have been training diligently since the first of the year and their respective coaches report them to be in the best of condition.

Theodore "Pump" Searle, who has charge of the meet, stated yesterday that he looks for the natators to put up stirring battles this evening in order that they
