

Close Races Feature Of Swim Trials

Finals Slated for Friday
Night in U. of H.
Tank

TRIALS for the second meet of the Hawaiian Indoor swimming championships, which will be held Friday evening in the University of Hawaii tank, were staged last night and presaging a gruelling compet, the race in each heat was hard fought.

The meet on Friday will start promptly at 7 o'clock with the diving which will feature Art Rutherford and Blaylock, of Roosevelt, S. Arakawa, M. Morris, L. Snyder of the 40 and 8, and D. Fleetham, Unattached.

Theodore Searle, in charge of the meet, announced last night that the 220-yard breaststroke open Hawaiian championship event which was not held as scheduled last week in the opening meet because of lack of entries, will be put on the program for the final meet of the series on April 26.

He also said that due to the fact that next Friday will be Good Friday, the third meet of the championships will be held Thursday evening with the trials on Wednesday as scheduled.

CRAW, DOBLE WIN

Wilbur Craw, of the University of Hawaii, won the first heat in the 220-yard freestyle open Hawaiian championship event in 2 minutes, 31 3/5 seconds, while Doble, of the Army, who made a great showing last Friday evening in the 500-yard freestyle, turned in a time of 2 minutes, 35 2/5 seconds.

Other qualifiers were Wendel Bayne of Roosevelt, William Waldlich of the Army, Kiyoshi Kuramoto of the University and Eddie Nakamura of the 40 and 8.

In the 220-yard breaststroke junior Hawaiian championship event, Milliken, Unattached, was first in the first heat in the time of 3 minutes, 16 4/5 seconds and C. Chang, of Nuuanu Y, won the second heat in 3 minutes, 17 seconds.

N. Aluli, of the University, won the initial heat of the 100-yard backstroke novice for men and stopped the watches at 1:14 2/5 seconds, while Quaintance of the same school took the second heat in one minute 17 1/5 seconds.

In the 100-yard backstroke for boys under 16, F. Tanaka and C. Webster captured the first and second heats, respectively in 1:15:2 and 1:17.

M. Holden, of the Outrigger Canoe Club, registered 1:40:3 while Margaret Morse was clocked at 1:25:1 in the 100-yard backstroke novice for women.

With several of the entrants
