

KEEN RACES ON TAP TOMORROW IN SWIM MEET

**Favorites Come Through In
Trials; April 18 Meet Is
Moved a Day Ahead**

In general, favorites came through with flying colors in the trials last night at the University of Hawaii pool for the second meet of the current Hawaiian AAU indoor swimming championships, scheduled tomorrow.

The meet will start at 7 p. m. with the diving competition featuring such competitors as Arthur Rutherford of Roosevelt, S. Arakawa, M. Morris, L. Snyder of the 40 & 8 club and D. Fleetham, unattached.

Announcement was made last night by Chairman Theodore (Pump) Searle of a change in the date of the third meet. Originally it was slated for next Friday, April 18.

However, next Friday is Good Friday, hence the meet has been moved up a day to Thursday. The trials, as usual, will be held on Wednesday.

Interesting races at the trials last night were witnessed in the 220 yard freestyle open Hawaiian championship event, the 220 yard breaststroke junior Hawaiian championship and the 100 yard backstroke novice for women.

Wilbur Craw of the University won the first heat of the 220 yard freestyle race in 2 minutes 31 3-5 seconds, while another favorite, E. Doble, Army, came through in his heat with the time of 2 minutes 35 2-5 seconds. A battle is predicted when both Doble and Craw meet in the race proper Friday.

Milliken, unattached, won the
