## Doble of Army Wins Sizzling 300 Medley; Slight Defends Title

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yard. The time was 4 minutes 32-5 seconds.

The defeat of Wendel Bayne, Roosevelt natator, in the 150 yard medley individual, men novice, was some sort of an upset. S. Kaurinana of the Citywide contingent of swimmers was first, F. Tanaka, 40 and 8, second, and Bayne a close third.

Bayne, however, led most of the way. His downfall came in the final lap where both Kaurinana and Tanaka showed powerful reserve sprints to the wall. The time was 1 minute 50 4-5 seconds.

Mildred Slight, OCC mermaid, successfully defended her first title in the swimming championships when she came through with a victory in the 300 yard medley individual women open swim in the time of 4 minutes 52 3-5 seconds.

She won quite easily from Betty Stevenson, OCC, and A. Ridley, OCC, who finished second and third respectively.

### Close Battle

The 300 yard medley relay, men open, was another event that provided high excitement and constant interest. The University of Hawaii team, composed of N. Aluli, A. Desha and Wilbur Craw, won the race in 3 minutes 26 3-5 seconds only after a stiff fight from the Central YMCA trio of Kapua Harris, Sam Harris and Johnny Woodd.

Kapua Harris started off strong to give the Central Y team a small lead. Brother Sam Harris also retained this lead to give Johnny Woodd, one time ace swimmer of the territory in the short events, the jump on Wilbur Craw, university's anchor man.

Both Wood and Craw set a fast pace in the final 100 yard freestyle setto. Up to the final 25 yards Woodd was able to stay out in front by a margin of a yard. Craw, however, had too much of a finish for Woodd as they thundered down the homestretch neck and neck. Victory was the university's by half a yard. Nuuanu YMCA pulled in for third place.

### Du Bois Again

C. DuBois of the University won the 100 yard freestyle, men junior, in the time of 58 seconds flat. D. Hughes, unattached, was second, while S. Randall, university, finished third. The race was close all the way through. Du Bois won by about a yard and a half.

Laurel Ensminger, Roosevelt lassie, won the 100 yard breaststroke, women junior, from A. Albrechtson, 40 and 8, and A. Jay, unattached, who finished in the order mentioned. The time was 1 minute 38 4-5 seconds.
