

UNIVERSITY ANNEXES INDOOR SWIMMING MEET CHAMPIONSHIP

Rainbows Register 131 Points—40 and 8 Is Second With 94—Wilbur Craw Wins Hundred Freestyle Open—Rutherford Tops Divers

WILBUR CRAW of the University of Hawaii won the Hawaiian championship in the 100-yard freestyle last night in the final meet of the annual Indoor Swimming championships.

Craw was in rare form and negotiated the century in 57 4/5 seconds to nose out William Waidlich of the Army. Doble, also of the Army, finished third.

The race was close all the way and gave the spectators plenty of excitement.

The team championship went to the University of Hawaii. The Rainbows amassed a total of 131 points. The 40 and 8 was next with 94. Palama followed with 81, Roosevelt 60, and Outrigger Canoe Club with 54.

Other teams finished as follows: Citywide 37, Army 23, Nuuanu Y 19, and Central Y 9.

Molly Webster of the University of Hawaii won the 100-yard freestyle open Hawaiian championship for women when she showed her heels to Betty Stevenson and Marion De Russey, who finished in the order given.

Miss Webster's time was 1 minute 11 4/5 seconds.

ARMITAGE BEATEN

A. Armitage, who surprised the fans the other night in the trials by winning one of the heats in the 100-yard freestyle novice for men in 58 seconds flat was defeated in the finals last evening by Kaulinana of the Citywide club. Armitage was second and Wong of Palama third.

Registering the time of 3 minutes 4 seconds, Adolph Desha of the University won the 230-yard breaststroke Hawaiian championship event. Waidlich was close behind him. Chester Chang of Nuuanu Y was third.

In the 400-yard Hawaiian championship relay for women, Outrigger Canoe club was first with University of Hawaii second and Roosevelt third. The winning time was 5 minutes 7 1/5 seconds.

A relay over the same distance with the title at stake saw the University of Hawaii Second Team nose out the University of Hawaii First Team in the time of 3 minutes 56 1/5 seconds.

Kiyoshi Kuramoto of the University of Hawaii won the junior championship in the 230-yard freestyle from Nishihama of the Nuuanu Y. Only two swimmers participated. The time was 2 minutes 45 2/5 seconds.

Molly Webster of the University captured the championship of the 150-yard individual medley junior event for women, beating Miss Akamine of Palama and Miss Eslinger of Roosevelt. Her time was 2 minutes 15 2/5 seconds.

First honors in the 100-yard backstroke junior Hawaiian championship for women went to Margaret Morse, unattached. Her time was 1 minute 24 seconds. Miss Karratti and Miss Kane were second and third respectively.

F. Tanaka won the 300-yard individual medley junior championship by turning back the challenge of Kaulinana of the Citywide club, his time being 4 minutes 11 2/5 seconds.

Displaying great form, Art Rutherford of Roosevelt won the one meter board diving for the Hawaiian championship with Snyder second and Arakawa third.
