

DEAN MERMEN GRAB INDOOR SWIM HONORS

Pile Up 131 Points In Four Meets; Rainbows Collect 13 of 29 Titles

Annexing six out of the 10 Hawaiian championships at stake, the University of Hawaii natators last night at their own tank swam to a convincing victory of the 1935 Hawaiian AAU indoor swimming championships.

During the course of the four meets, the Deans piled up a total of 131 points to 94 for the 40 & 8 club, their nearest rival.

The scores of the other teams were as follows: Palama, 61; Roosevelt high school, 60; Outrigger Canoe club, 54; Unattached, 50; Citywide, 37; Army, 22; Nuuanu YMCA, 19, and Central YMCA, 9. Wilbur Crow, Dean swimmer, was victorious by a margin of a yard over W. Waidlich, Army, in the 100 yard freestyle men open. Hawaiian championship, swim last night in the time of 57 4-5 seconds. E. Doble, also of the Army, finished a close third.

The race was teeming with interest throughout the four laps. The three named above were never separated to any great extent during the course of the century Crow showed splendid condition with a strong, powerful finish.

Waidlich, by virtue of a determined spurt in the last 25 yards, gained second place over Doble, who had kept neck and neck with Crow in the first three laps.

Molly Webster Shines

Molly Webster, Dean mermaid, came in for more than her share of the honors in last night's meet. She garnered victories in the 100 yard freestyle, women open and the 150 yards medley individual women's junior, both of which were for Hawaiian championships.

To add to this, she also swam the anchor lap in the second place winning University team in the 400 yards relay women open, Hawaiian championship.

Excellent swimming by A. Ridley, OCC third swimmer in the 400 yard relay, women open, Hawaiian championship, brought about their victory over the University team. Mildred Slaght swam the last 100 yards for the OCC team. She overcame M. Webster, University anchor, in the final lap of the race.

At that, M. Webster, who had already won two Hawaiian championship races, showed her gameness and perfect physical condition. The time was 5 minutes 11 1-5 seconds.

Desha Winner

Adolph Desha, University swimmer, won the 220 yards breaststroke, men open, Hawaiian championship, in the time of 3 minutes 4 seconds. W. Waidlich, Army, was second about two yards behind. C. Chang of the Nuuanu YMCA finished third but a fraction of a foot behind Waidlich.

Of the 29 Hawaiian championship events during the course of the four weeks of swimming, University of Hawaii annexed 13, Roosevelt high school and 40 & 8, four; unattached, three; Outrigger Canoe club and Army, two, and Nuuanu YMCA, one.
