In a sizzler which required more than an hour and a half to play, the Aloha Amateurs eked out a great victory over the Outrigger Canoe club last evening in the Hawaiian AAU senior volleyball league race at the Central Y hall.

A crowd which packed the sidelines to capacity witnessed the titanic slamfest. The score was 15-9, 12-15 and 15-10.

In the appetizer, Palama mowed down the University of Hawaii in jig fashion, 15-3 and 15-10.

Led by Al Braun, J. Nobrega and J. Keliikipi, the Alohas got the jump in the opening set, working to count to 11-2. However, the Outriggers threw up a great defense here and held that score for more than half an hour. While the OCC slammers added seven more points, the Alohas tallied the necessary four to win the set.

The Surfriders made a great comeback in the middle set. They ran up a lead of 8-1 before the Alohas came to life. But it was too late for the eventual winners, as the margin gave the Outriggers the set at 15-12.

Both teams felt the pace in the final set. The defending champion Amateurs, with superior slammers, were able to maintain a faster pace than their rivals, winning 15-10.
