

Star-Bulletin Swims At Natatorium On May 30

Sanction to stage the annual Memorial Day swims at the War Memorial natatorium has been recommended by The Honolulu Star-Bulletin from Henry O. Pfaender, chairman of the Hawaiian AAU committee.

In a few days, and at the most at the beginning of next week, entry blanks will be made available to all those desiring to participate in the swims.

The events are the 880 yards open freestyle for women, one mile freestyle for senior men and one mile freestyle for junior men.

Defending champions are Miss Olga Clarke in the 880 yard freestyle swim for women; Maurice Furusho, senior men's mile, and

Eddie Nakamura, junior men's mile. Miss Clarke, in breaking her own record last year, swam for the Out-rigger Canoe club. Furusho wore the colors of the Hui Makani, while Eddie Nakamura represented the 40 & 8 club.

It is expected that these defending champions will again compete this year.

Pressing hard on the heels of the defenders will be a group of promising younger material that is slowly, but surely, being developed at the University of Hawaii, as well as at the various high schools on the island.
