

Night Surfing Show Thursday

For years, and perhaps even generations, moonlight surfing has been enjoyed out at Waikiki on those rare nights when the moon is full and the surf running high. But this Thursday at Waikiki the first searchlight surfing and canoeing party in history will be held.

The novel aquatic program will be staged by the Outrigger Canoe club on the holiday night, through the courtesy of adjacent U.S. army forts, which will play the beams of huge searchlights across the beach. Millions of candlepower will make the scene like day.
